Build a puppet theatre using a shoe box. Make the characters using lollipop sticks.

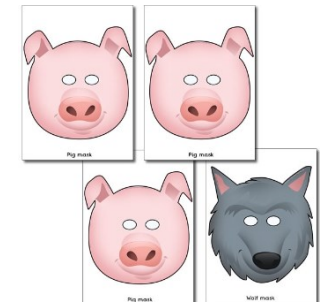
Paint each of the characters. Record adjectives around each character to describe their appearance and personalities.

Write an alternative version of the story. Eg. The 3 Little Wolves and the Big Bad Pig! Think about the setting, characters, beginning, middle, ending. Can you use adjectives, different sentence openers, adverbs, conjunctions, capital letters, full stops, speech marks and question marks? Don't forget to use cursive handwriting and think about your phonics!

Hot seating. Turn yourself in to the wolf! Grown-ups can ask you questions about your actions/behaviour and you must respond in role!



Write a book review. What are the main events in the story? Who would you recommend the book to and why? What was your favourite part of the story? Draw your favourite scenes and design a new front cover for the book.
