

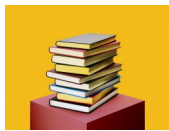
Daily Activities

Poetry:

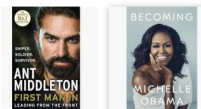
Write and Easter poem using simile and metaphors.

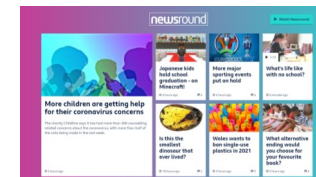
