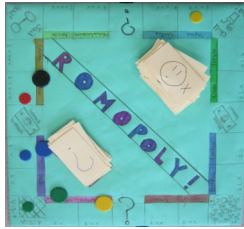


Create your own board game all about the Romans. Be creative. Think about forfeits and rewards linked to the Romans. How could you design the counters? Do you have to visit famous places?

Explore beats and rhythms for the Roman army to march to.

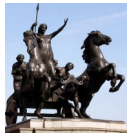
Research Roman musical instruments

Learn about your skeleton and how they are designed to act like armour for different organs.

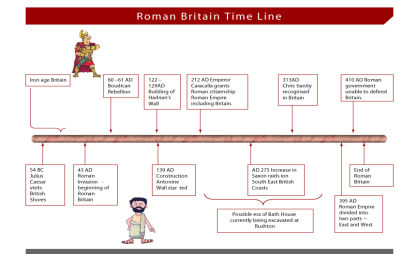


Year 4 - Romans
